

## Arizona Domestic Violence Laws

<p><b>1. Assault: 13-1203</b> Causing physical injury to another person, placing that person in reasonable fear of immediate physical injury, or knowingly touching another person with intent to injure, insult, or provoke such person.</p>	<p><b>6. Endangerment 13-1201</b> A person commits endangerment by recklessly endangering another person with a substantial risk of imminent death or physical injury.</p>
<p><b>2. Criminal damage 13-1602</b> A person commits criminal damage by recklessly defacing or damaging property of another person; or tampering with property of another person so as substantially to impair its function or value.</p>	<p><b>7. Dangerous crimes against children 13-705</b> A crime committed against a child under the age of 15, including, but not limited to, sexual assault, prostitution, child abuse, aggravated assault, or involving a minor in a drug offense.</p>
<p><b>3. Interfering with judicial proceedings 13-2810</b> A person commits interfering with judicial proceedings if such person knowingly: Engages in disorderly, disrespectful or insolent behavior during the session of a court which directly tends to interrupt its proceedings or impairs the respect due to its authority; or Disobeys or resists the lawful order, process or other mandate of a court</p>	<p><b>8. Custodial interference 13-1302</b> A person commits custodial interference if, knowing or having reason to know that the person has no legal right to do so.</p>
<p><b>4. Disorderly conduct 13-2904 (A) 1-3 &amp; 6</b> A person commits disorderly conduct if, with intent to disturb the peace or quiet of a neighborhood, family or person, or with knowledge of doing so, such person: Engages in fighting, violent or seriously disruptive behavior; or 2. Makes unreasonable noise; or 3. Uses abusive or offensive language or gestures to any person present in a manner likely to provoke immediate physical retaliation by such person; or 6. Recklessly handles displays or discharges a deadly weapon or dangerous instrument.</p>	<p><b>9. Kidnapping 13-1304. (1-4)</b> A person commits kidnapping by knowingly restraining another person with the intent to: 1. Hold the victim for ransom, as a shield or hostage; or 2. Hold the victim for involuntary servitude; or 3. Inflict death, physical injury or a sexual offense on the victim, or to otherwise aid in the commission of a felony.</p>
<p><b>5. Threatening or intimidating 13-1202</b> A person commits threatening or intimidating if the person threatens or intimidates by word or conduct to cause physical injury to another person or serious damage to the property of another.</p>	<p><b>10. Unlawful imprisonment 13-1303</b> Knowingly restraining a person by restricting his/her movement without his/her consent, without legal authority AND in a manner which interferes substantially with a person's liberty by either moving a person from one place to another or confining that person.</p>

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<p><b>11. Criminal trespass 13-1502</b>          1. Knowingly entering or remaining unlawfully on any real property after a reasonable request to leave by the owner or any other person having lawful control over such property, or reasonable notice prohibiting entry.          2. Knowingly entering or remaining unlawfully on the right-of-way for tracks, or the storage or switching yards or rolling stock of a railroad company.          B. Criminal trespass in the third degree is a class 3 misdemeanor.</p>	<p><b>14. Use of telephone to terrify, intimidate, threaten, harass, annoy or offend 13-2916</b>          To use a telephone and use any obscene, lewd or profane language or suggest any lewd or lascivious act, or threaten to inflict physical harm to the person or property of any person. It is also unlawful to otherwise disturb by repeated anonymous telephone calls the peace, quiet or right of privacy of any person at the place where the telephone call or calls were received.</p>
<p><b>12. Stalking 13-2923</b>          1. Would cause a reasonable person to fear for the person's safety or the safety of that person's immediate family member and that person in fact fears for their safety or the safety of that person's immediate family member.          2. Would cause a reasonable person to fear death of that person or that person's immediate family member and that person in fact fears death of that person or that person's immediate family member.</p>	<p><b>15. Harassment 13-2921</b>          1. Anonymously or otherwise contacts, communicates or causes a communication with another person by verbal, electronic, mechanical, telegraphic, telephonic or written means in a manner that harasses.          2. Continues to follow another person in or about a public place for no legitimate purpose after being asked to desist.          3. Repeatedly commits an act or acts that harass another person.          4. Surveils or causes another person to surveil a person for no legitimate purpose.</p>
<p><b>13. Aggravated assault 13-1204</b> If anyone commits assault AND causes serious physical injury OR used a deadly weapon OR committed the assault after breaking into the victim's home, OR if the victim was bound or restricted during the assault.</p>	<p><b>16. Child or vulnerable adult abuse; emotional abuse 13-3623</b>          A. Under circumstances likely to produce death or serious physical injury, any person who causes a child or vulnerable adult to suffer physical injury or, having the care or custody of a child or vulnerable adult, who causes or permits the person or health of the child or vulnerable adult to be injured or who causes or permits a child or vulnerable adult to be placed in a situation where the person or health of the child or vulnerable adult is endangered</p>
